



Carnegie New Leaders – Overview and Policy

The Carnegie New Leaders (CNL) program provides a forum for young professionals to establish a new approach to global leadership. By examining the ethical dimensions of today's most pressing global issues with leading experts, CNL members lay the foundation for ethics-based leadership.

Mission Statement

To cultivate the next generation of ethical global leaders in business, academia, government, and the nonprofit sector.

About Carnegie New Leaders

CNL members are diverse and dynamic individuals, aged 40 and under. They come from various sectors and backgrounds, but share an interest in the interplay between ethics and leadership at both the global and local levels and advocate a more just, socially responsible, and transparent world.

CNL members enjoy the following privileges and responsibilities:

- **Exclusive access** to CNL events
- **Exceptional networking opportunities**
- **Opportunity to shape CNL content**, propose speakers and convene events
- **Online publishing opportunities**, related to program themes
- **Expand CNL's membership** by nominating at least TWO potential CNL members a year to join the program.

How it works

The Carnegie New Leaders meet in both educational and social contexts to foster global ethical leadership. Social events provide space for informal discussion and networking. Educational events are organized around different content themes relating to ethical global leadership.

The CNL program themes for 2012 are:

- Aid effectiveness in the developing world
- The ethics of military intervention
- Sovereign bailouts: who's responsible?
- Lessons of leadership

During individual sessions, speakers investigate questions such as:

- What challenges confront global ethical leadership?
- How can those challenges be better addressed?
- What approaches have been successful or unsuccessful?
- What skills are necessary to be an effective moral leader?

CNL members often moderate events. Audio, video, and text resources from these events are made available for further discussion online. CNL members publish analysis as each theme is concluded, sharing it online with their peers.

The CNL program is overseen by the Carnegie Council staff, the CNL Steering Committee, and the honorary trustee. The Steering Committee works with CNL members and Carnegie Council staff to plan social events, facilitate marketing and development, and provide input on the content of educational events. The honorary trustee represents and reports on the CNL program to the Carnegie Council Board of Trustees.

Steering Committee

The Steering Committee meets quarterly to plan social events, facilitate marketing and development, and provide input on the content of educational events. Committee members are asked to serve on an annual basis and are expected to participate in programming and development.

The Council seeks the following criteria when selecting new Committee members:

- Participated actively as a CNL member for at least one year
- Willingness to assist in programming and development and able to make the time commitment outside of the regularly scheduled events
- Fostered the CNL's goals and commitment to global ethics
- Will adhere to CNL and Carnegie Council policies

The Honorary CNL Trustee

Each year, one CNL member is selected to serve on the Carnegie Council's Board of Trustees and Steering Committee. The honorary trustee is selected by Carnegie Council staff on the basis of his/her level of activity and contribution to the CNL program. .

In this capacity, the honorary trustee is required to attend board meetings twice a year in order to report on the CNL program, actively engage in its development, and help coordinate events.

Proposing Events and Speakers

All CNL members can propose event topics and speakers. To propose a CNL event or speaker, CNL members are required to fill out the "Speaker/Event Suggestion Form," which is located at <http://www.cceia.org/programs/current/291/index.html>.

If a suggestion is approved by the Steering Committee, the member who proposed the event will then help to coordinate and possibly moderate the event.

Application Process

To apply to the CNL program, please submit the following documentation to Stefanie Ambrosio at cnl@cceia.org:

1. A letter (or email) that discusses your thoughts regarding the following questions:
 - What are the challenges of ethical leadership in your field or industry? How would you address these issues?
 - How do you think the CNL program will help you enhance your own leadership skills?
 - How do you see yourself leveraging these skills in your sector or organization?
